Subj: **Staff Report – RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE *REGIONAL MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN***

Policy Question

Platte City Officials in conjunction with Platte County, Management, Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) and the State Emergency Management Agency Management have developed an emergency operations plan. The adoption by a resolution of the local board in each participating city, to obtain final FEMA approval of the plan, which will then make our community eligible to apply for mitigation project grant funding.

Should the elected officials formally approve the 2015 RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE *REGIONAL MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN*?

Summary

The 2015 update of the Platte County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan has been completed and FEMA is prepared to grant final approval of the plan once it has been formally adopted by our jurisdiction and other participating local governments; to include Mid-America Regional Council (MARC).

Background

The City in conjunction with the Platte County Emergency Management, Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) and the State Emergency Management Agency have developed an emergency operations plan to assist local officials in responding to and recovering from the effects of natural and man-made disasters.



In our country's system of emergency management, local government must act first to attend to the public's emergency needs. Depending on the nature and size of the emergency, State and Federal assistance may be provided to the local jurisdiction. The local EOP focuses on the measures that are essential for protecting the public. These include warning, emergency public information, evacuation, and shelter.

When disasters threaten or strike a jurisdiction, people expect elected leaders to take immediate action to deal with the problem. The government is expected to organize its resources, channel the efforts of voluntary agencies and private enterprise in the community, and solicit assistance from outside of the jurisdiction if necessary.

Alternatives

There are no true alternatives; if there is a natural or man-made disaster the City will need the assistance of the County, State and Federal resources to respond to and recover from the disaster.

Fiscal Impact

State and Federal funding could be denied or substantially reduced.

Legal Impact

The elected leadership in each jurisdiction is legally responsible for ensuring that necessary and appropriate actions are taken to protect people and property from the consequences of emergencies and disasters.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen adopts the *REGIONAL MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN* and authorize the Mayor to sign the resolution.

**A SPECIAL ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REGIONAL MULTI-HAZARD
MITIGATION PLAN.**

WHEREAS, *City of Platte City*, with the assistance from the Mid-America Regional Council, has gathered information and prepared the *Regional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan*; and,

WHEREAS, the *Regional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan* has been prepared in accordance with FEMA requirements at 44 C.F.R. 201.6; and,

WHEREAS, *City of Platte City* is a local unit of government that has afforded the citizens an opportunity to comment and provide input in the Plan and the actions in the Plan; and

WHEREAS, *Board of Alderman* has reviewed the Plan and affirms that the Plan will be updated no less than every five years;

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PLATTE CITY, MISSOURI
as follows:**

SECTION 1. Adopts the *Regional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan* as this jurisdiction's Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, and resolves to execute the actions in the Plan.

SECTION 2. This bill is a special ordinance and shall not be incorporated into the Platte City Code.
