**Caution...Road Construction Ahead**

**Asphalt Program:** Asphalt replacement on Fourth, Zed Martin, Thomas and Wells Streets will be completed during the week of May 9th. The City apologizes for any inconvenience due to the project delay.

**Highway 92/Kentucky project: Beginning May 16th, Highway 92 from I-29 to Kentucky Ave will be reduced to one-lane each way.** MoDOT expects Hwy 92 will resume two-lane each way traffic when the reconstruction project is completed this fall. Additional traffic notices will be released for each phase of this project. This project will extend Kentucky Avenue north through the QuikTrip/McDonald's area.



**Fourth Street Traffic:** Two-way traffic will be restored on Fourth Street the week of May 17th.

**Kentucky Ave:** The extension of Kentucky Avenue from Bent Oak to Fourth Street is on schedule for a late-August completion.

## SIDEWALK REPAIR COST SHARE PROGRAM

The City has a cost share program to ease the financial burden of sidewalk upkeep and replacement. Although property owners are responsible for maintaining the sidewalk in front or alongside their house, the City cost share can help cut repair costs in half. If the sidewalk in front of your property is in a dangerous or defective condition contact the Public Works Department at 858-4815 for more information.

## *Warm Temperatures + Wet Weather = Mosquitoes* *Protect your home and family from mosquito borne illness*



Recent rains, combined with increasing temperatures, means it is mosquito season in Platte City. In addition to that annoying itch from mosquito bites, mosquitoes can carry illness that could affect you, your family and your household pets.

### Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes outside your home:

- Install or repair and use window and door screens. Do not leave doors propped open.
- Once a week, empty, scrub, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near standing water.
- Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes can not get inside to lay eggs.
- For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- Use larvicide to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or emptied.
- Use an outdoor flying insect spray where mosquitoes rest. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid areas (under carports or patio furniture or in a garage). When using insecticide, always follow the label instructions.
- Repair cracks or gaps in septic tanks. Use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito to cover open vents or plumbing pipes.

### Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes inside your home:

- Keep windows and doors shut. Use air conditioning when possible.
- Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs inside your home. Once a week, empty, scrub, cover, or throw out any items that hold water, like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- Kill mosquitoes inside your home. Use an indoor flying insect fogger\* or indoor insect spray\* to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow the label directions. Note: only using insecticide will not keep your home free of mosquitoes.
- Use an indoor fogger\* or indoor insect spray\* to reach and treat areas where mosquitoes rest inside the home. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid places like under the sink, in closets, under furniture, or in the laundry room.
