Wastewater Projects and Rate Adjustments 5 to 7 year plan

The City is entering a five to seven year period including several major wastewater systems projects including:

- Final six years of the 15 year effort to reline all sanitary sewers
- Complete installation of upgraded sanitary sewer line under 92 Highway at Casey’s General Store
- Partner with the US Army Corps of Engineers to protect the North Sewer Interceptor line along the Platte River (south of 92 Hwy)
- Mid-life rehabilitation of the current Wastewater Treatment Plant in 2025



Several of these projects have been underway for a number of years; all scheduled for completion by 2025.

Funding these wastewater projects will have an effect on sanitary sewer rates each year between now and 2025. Sewer revenue needs to increase approximately 5% each year to fund these projects with the first change appearing on bills due August 20th. The 2019 adjustment adds \$1.30 to the minimum monthly sewer fee plus 13 cents for each additional 1,000 gallons of use. Although rate increases are never welcome, an annual series of smaller increases is preferable to a sudden much larger increase as major sewer projects are started.

Water Rate Adjustments



Drinking water rates will also have a 5% increase effective with the August bills. However, this change is expected to be a one time adjustment. Mostly impact the minimum month rates. Water rates over the next five to seven years are expected to range from 1% to 2% annually depending on changes in the wholesale water rates from the Kansas City Water Department.
