## Holiday Lighting Ceremony November 27th 5:30 p.m.

The community is invited to the annual holiday lighting ceremony on Main Street in downtown Platte City.



Free family event includes activities for all ages: Santa’s reindeer, horse drawn carriage rides, face painting, balloon artist, holiday make it–take it, children’s Main Street “sticker stop” game, visit the Snow Princess, refreshments and visit with Santa and Mrs. Claus.

Free hotdogs, chili, chips, cookies and water will be at the Central Platte Fire District Building at Third and Main Street. Other treats will be available on Main Street. Food trucks will also be on Third Street with items available for purchase.

A free shuttle service from the Platte County RIII High School parking lot to downtown will be provided. Trolleys will leave the high school parking lot beginning at 4:45 p.m. Drop off and pick up locations downtown are the intersections of Fourth and Main Street and Second and Main Street. Trolley routes run every 15-20 minutes throughout the event.

Final pick up downtown will be at 9:00 p.m. to return riders to the Platte County High School parking lot.

City Green Waste facility will close on December 2, 2019 for the season, but will open for Christmas tree disposal on December 26, 2019 and close on January 9, 2020 until spring.



Access fee is \$20 per year for City residents. City residential customers may purchase a card at City Hall.

Candidate filing opens December 17, 2019 and closes January 21, 2020. Candidates may file for the offices listed below with the City Clerk during business hours Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. to Noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- Mayor 2 Year Term
- Alderman of Ward One 2 Year Term
- Alderman of Ward Two 2 Year Term
- Alderman of Ward Three 2 Year Term

December 24th, 25th & January 1st.

Qualifications for declaration of candidacy **Mayor**:

- At least 25 years of age
- Registered voter
- A resident of Platte City for 1 year prior to the election (you must have been a resident of Platte City no later than April 7, 2019 to be eligible)

Qualifications for declaration of candidacy **Alderman**:

- At least 18 years of age
- Registered voter
- A resident of Platte City for 1 year prior to the election (*Must have been a resident of Platte City no later than April 7, 2019 to be eligible*)
- A resident of the ward in which you are filing
